

A Letter from the Mayor

I hope that everyone had a great summer. As I look back at all the activities this summer-- the symphony and jazz concerts in Beard Park, the Memorial Day parade, the Blues concert in Canal Landing Park, the flower pots throughout the village, the block parties, garage sales, movies in the park-- these and many other activities are what make the village a great place to raise your family.

As the children head back to school, the village is working on several projects before the leaves start to fall. We are finishing several drainage and road projects, as well as replacing and repairing sidewalks throughout the village. We are repairing the Canal Landing Park where we lost some landscaping due to the dry summer as well as filling in some high spots in the park that prevent a level viewing during concerts or activities in the park. We also have hired a contractor to repair the break wall at the end of West Elm Street. Over the next few months, these and several other projects will be finalized before the snow falls.

The village has been fortunate over the last few years to receive several grants to help us with our parks, sidewalks, paving projects, curbing, streetscape improvements, flood and draining projects. These grants have been able to make sure we continue to provide the services our residents want as well as keeping our infrastructure sound. One grant received was to stabilize the banks of Limestone Creek behind the Town Hall and Canal Landing Park and was completed by our DPW crew. By doing it in-house, we saved several thousands of dollars and the project turned out great. Please take a moment to look at all the improvements in this area.

The Route 5 culvert pipe repair project has been delayed until October. We are meeting with the NYS DOT the first part of September to work out all the detour details as well as voicing our concerns for truck traffic, pedestrian concerns and, most importantly, how we can maintain the quality of life for all the residents affected by this detour. We will continue to work with the NYS DOT, Police Department, Fire Department, DPW and all stake holders involved with this project. The plans for the project are in the village hall, so please stop by and review them if you have questions or concerns.

We are starting to work on several internal reviews like our health insurance policies, financial audit, sign law revisions, local law revisions, and opportunity areas in our commercial developments in the village, as well as several other projects. Many of these initiatives and projects may not be able to be physically seen but they are very important to the vitality of the village. These important projects will keep the village moving in a positive direction now and for years to come. Keep an eye out over the next several newsletter or our web sites for updates.

I hope that you've had a chance to relax this summer and spend time doing what you love. The village has been fortunate to continue our tradition of being very busy and I'm looking forward to the upcoming months as we finish several projects, start new ones, and plan for next year's projects. If you have any questions or would like any information on the village, please feel free to call or email the village hall. Again, thank you for allowing me to serve as your mayor.


Fayetteville Senior Center Neighborhood Connection

Dear Fayetteville-Manlius friends and neighbors: Glenn Ritchie is working with the Fayetteville Senior Center to create a program whereby a group of unconnected volunteers can individually touch the life of a lonely or infirm senior citizen in one of our neighborhoods. A recent local study has shown that the greatest need in our senior population is a connection to others. He is only asking each of you, individually or as a family, to volunteer your e-mail address for the project. This initiative is an effort to provide some basic connections on a very voluntary level. Here's how it would work:

1. Volunteer added to e-mail list
2. Senior Center receives a request - simple visit, light repair, easy yard work, etc.
3. E-mail blast to all volunteers goes out with request and its particulars;
4. Those with ability and desire to handle request respond in the affirmative to e-mail;
5. Second e-mail blast goes out saying request has been filled.

A volunteer could conceivably be on the list for months before feeling called to answer in the affirmative to a request, during which time there is no pressure or contact.



Village of Fayetteville DPW

The Department of Public Works has begun leaf pickup for the fall season. The trucks will be around on a continuous rotating basis. Place leaves along the curb, not in the road or near storm drains. Leaves should not be placed in bags or other containers because the village uses vacuum-operated leaf pickers. It is especially important that no rocks or branches are mixed in with the leaves.

PLEASE USE ONLY 35 GALLON OR SMALLER TRASH CONTAINERS. FOR SAFETY REASONS, THE CONTAINER AND ITS CONTENTS SHOULD NOT WEIGH MORE THAN 55 POUNDS.

If you have pumpkins for disposal, just place them beside your trash, not in the container, and they will be picked up.

DPW: Things Worth Noting



Due to the Thanksgiving holiday on Thursday November 22, 2012 trash pick-up for that Thursday will be moved to Monday November 26, 2012.

SNOW SEASON REMINDERS:

It is also worth remembering that parking of any kind on any village streets is prohibited from November 1 to April 1 between the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am. Please also avoid parking across public sidewalks so the sidewalk plow operator can get through. It is a violation of New York State Vehicle and Traffic law for anyone to place snow in the street.

Enjoy autumn and all the activities that are planned by the Village and community organizations.

Attention Seniors and others who receive government checks will be mailed. All payments will be made using direct deposit to a financial institution. If you are currently receiving a Federal Government check in the mail, you must establish an account in a bank or credit union for this direct deposit. Most financial institutions have a form to fill out for a smooth transition for your payment.

Codes: Many questions arise concerning that you may wish to do on your property. Most questions regarding changes or projects can be answered by calling the Village Office. If the change is more complex, it will be best to meet with the codes officer for a more detailed explanation, and the procedures to follow regarding this change. In any case, it is best to check out the legality of a project prior to starting it. It is important to know that different laws apply in different zones. So what was done by a friend in one type of zone may have a different rule in your zone.

In each newsletter, the DPW (who does a great job) puts in information regarding times when refuse items are scheduled for "pick up." I drive throughout the Village each week, and I am amazed at the items that are at the curb even though the schedule for picking up these items is weeks away. Hopefully, residents who do not have a DPW card with information regarding times for various items to be picked up will request one from the DPW office.

Bricks for Veterans Park honoring service men and women are a great idea to honor your favorite veteran. For information concerning buying a brick, contact the Village Office.

Please eliminate any standing water in containers on your property. Mosquitoes breed quickly in this water and are a health danger to all of us. Rain barrels are a great idea, but within 3 days mosquito larva will exist.

Codes Enforcement

The Village of Fayetteville needs everyone to do their part to make our community a place to be proud of and asks all property owners/residents to follow the rules set forth in our village Code by:

- Maintaining grass, weeds or other uncultivated vegetation on your property including around telephone poles, mailboxes, trees, etc. so its height does not exceed 6 inches.
 - If your property is located on a corner lot, no fence, wall, hedge or other similar planting shall be more than 3.5 feet in height 30ft. from the intersection (measured along street lines.)
- Parking all motor vehicles in your driveway only. It is prohibited to park in the front yard or within 5 feet of any side or rear lot line of a residential property.
 - No abandoned, junked, discarded or unlicensed motor vehicles shall be stored in the Village.
 - No trailer, house trailer, motor home, camper, boat, watercraft or other recreational vehicles shall be stored out of doors in a residential district except in the rear yard and not closer than 5 feet to the side or rear lot lines.
- Placing yard waste, rubbish and garbage at the curb no sooner than the night before the day of scheduled pickup.
 - Please take electronic equipment (TVs, computers, etc.) to the FM Bottle Return in Manlius. OCRRRA prohibits the village to pick up this type of equipment.
- Limiting pickup of any debris and fill material to that generated only by the resident who resides at the location of generation and placed to curb no sooner than the Thursday before the 3rd Friday of month for fill material or the Thursday before the LAST Friday of month for construction debris.
 - The DPW will not pick up debris generated by a third-party contractor.
- Snowplowing so as not to cause snow to block sidewalks or collect on any property other than your own, especially by snowplow contractors.

Signs Advertising a Garage Sale, Household Items, or Lawn Sale.

- Only two garage, household items, or lawn sale signs shall be allowed:
 - One on the premises of the sale
 - One as a directional sign to the sale
- If a directional sign is placed on property other than that of the owner, written permission from the property owner shall be submitted to the Codes Enforcement Officer showing such permission, along with a statement from the holder of the sale stating what day the sign(s) shall be erected and what day it shall be removed.
- No sign shall exceed four square feet in total dimensions.
- No sign shall be displayed for a period to excess 72 hours.
- No sign shall be attached to fences, trees, utility poles or the like.
- No sign shall be placed in a position that will obstruct or impair vision or traffic or in any manner create a hazard or disturbance to the health and welfare of the general public.

* Code of the Village of Fayetteville, Chapter 187 Zoning, 187-28 Permit not required, C.
