We are preparing for another busy and exciting year in the village. Last year was an incredible year and I hope to build on that momentum, making 2012 even better.

We received a partial grant for the bridge to go over Limestone Creek near the old dam. This bridge will connect the Canal Landing Park to the Erie Canal Trail system and allow residents to enjoy these two special areas in our community. Our Parks Commission is putting together a RFP for engineering and architectural plans, while working diligently to get this project both started and completed this year so residents can begin to enjoy this great project. There will be more in the next newsletter, including hopefully a sketch, to share with everyone.

The Limestone Plaza area has experienced a boom in the past two years thanks to many new businesses, restaurants, bakery, salons and other special businesses. With this growth we are seeing a stress on our infrastructure that has not gone unnoticed. We had a traffic engineer study the area and make recommendations. We also have worked with State and County DOT officials to come up with what we feel will enhance the area and increase the safety for all residents that use this area. It will help traffic flow and add additional parking spots. We are fortunate to have this vibrant area in our community, but there will be some growing pains. So please be patient and be aware that this area sits next to a residential area. Drive safe.

This spring there is another project deserving your patience. The NYS DOT will be replacing the culvert pipe on Route

5 near the entrance to Brookside. This project is expected to take eight weeks to complete. While this project will cause many residents to use alternate routes to get to and from work, we expect the DOT to make the detours and inconveniences as smooth as possible. This project will also incorporate finishing the existing sidewalk allowing residents in that area to walk safely to and from the village. And perhaps those traveling through from outside our village will discover new ways to get to and from where they need to go. This I look at as a good thing for our village.

We are in full swing preparing the 2012-2013 budgets. In the past two years, we have lost 10% of our sales tax revenue (\$450,000) due to the new sales tax agreement. The governor has implemented a 2% tax cap and pensions costs are over \$250,000 a year. (To put this into perspective, when I started eight years ago it was around \$80,000.) I agree with the governor's notion that property taxes have to stop increasing year after year, but he signed this law into effect and he gave no mandate relief. Without mandate relief, we will not be able to control and reduce the tax burden on all New Yorkers. We will continue to look at every line and make sure we make the proper decisions to make Fayetteville continue to be a special place to live and raise a family while maintaining a stable tax rate.

2012 will be a year all Fayetteville residents can look forward to, not only because of these items I mentioned, but because of all the dedicated people who volunteer and work on behalf of the village of Fayetteville.

TREE CITY U.S.A. 11 YEARS RUNNING!

The Village of Fayetteville is proud of our “National Arbor Day Foundation Tree City USA” status that has been awarded to us for the last 11 years. We continually attempt to maintain our important street tree canopy for all the environmental and aesthetic benefits they provide for all village residents..

As some of you know, volunteer members of the Fayetteville Tree Commission do basic pruning on our village street trees. However, there are some larger trees that our volunteers cannot reach safely. Depending on the size of the job, the village DPW or contractors are enlisted to help prune and maintain our village street trees.

With pruning costs partially covered by a recent DEC urban forestry grant, Bartlett Tree Experts have completed pruning the southwest section of the village based on our DEC contract. Altogether, they pruned 386 trees including Grover Cleveland Park. This pruning included crown cleaning, crown raising, structural pruning, intersection clearance and even cabling a split sycamore on John Street. The village DPW crews were a great help with their prompt debris cleanup effort. Tree Commission Chair, Pat Tobin said, “I have driven all around and the Bartlett crews did a very efficient job which will really benefit our village trees for future years.”

THANK YOU to these wonderful volunteers, our DPW, and Bartlett Tree ensuring our “Tree City” and its beautiful trees will thrive.

Fire Dept Verifying Addresses Door-to-Door!

In the coming weeks members of the Fayetteville Fire Department will be conducting another fire safety program by going door to door to verify that each structure in the village has a visible address on it.

In order to comply with both state and village code, each structure must have the following:

- Address numbers, building numbers or building identification placed in a position that is plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property
- Numbers that contrast with their background
- Numbers that be Arabic numerals or alphabet letters.
- Must be a minimum of 4" high and at least 1/2" wide

The goal of this review is to allow us to respond to your address quickly in the event of an emergency; should responders be unable to verify the address, precious time may be lost.

Questions regarding this review should be directed to the on-duty officer at the fire department by calling (315) 637-6101. Thank you.

Should your home not have a smoke detector and you cannot obtain one, the Fire Department will provide one for you at no charge.

Congratulations, Jan, on your retirement!

Fayetteville Recreation director Jan Rybinski, has submitted her resignation. It is with sadness on our part that she is leaving, but with happiness for Jan as she enjoys many trips and much deserved relaxation. Throughout her 18 years as director, Jan has guided a valuable village organization with expertise and accomplishment. There are many children and counselors who have benefitted and enjoyed programs provided under Jan's tutelage. As Jan goes on her way, "May the sun shine on her face and may the Lord hold her in the palm of his hand."

Door-to-door sales requests have increased in the past two years, mainly due to the prohibition of phone solicitation. **Because of federal laws, we have to allow this practice.** When these solicitors request a permit, we have the police check each employees' record, establish time limits (normally 10am to 7pm), and each solicitor to carry ID and village authorization letter. You, as a resident, may prohibit someone from knocking on your door by posting a sign that says "No Solicitation" or "No Solicitors." If they disregard this notice, call the police or the village office to report this illegal solicitation.

Along with dog waste, one of our **most common complaints is motorists who do not stop at stop signs.** If we as residents make it a point to always stop, it will certainly show correct behavior for motorists from outside the village. If you are aware of persistent traffic problems, inform us at the village office or by calling the Town of Manlius Police 682-2212. If we as residents obey the traffic laws and are courteous to each other, we will continue to enjoy life in the village.

Important to note!


- Yard damage caused by Village of Fayetteville snowplows and pot holes on village streets will be repaired in the spring. You may call the Department of Public Works at 637-6065 or e-mail pmfdpw@verizon.net to report any problems.
- If you notice a street light out, on a telephone pole, please call the Clerk’s Office, 637-9864, or National Grid direct at 800-642-4272. If possible, locate the National Grid pole number since that will expedite replacing the light.
- If you have a sewer backup problem, BEFORE calling a plumber please call DPW 637-6065 . We will be able to determine if it is on your side of the cleanout or on the village side. If it is on the village side, we will take care of the problem.


