A Letter from the Mayor

I hope your enjoying the start of another beautiful spring in Fayetteville. In my trips throughout the village I'm noticing all the beautiful trees in bloom. Coming home from a baseball game the other night my ten year old son, Noah, commented on how "cool" the trees looked, coming from a ten year old I knew what he meant. The Tree Commission just hosted another Arbor Day Celebration at the Creative Environment Day School and we received our 13th annual Tree City USA Award. This committee along with the DPW has done an amazing job running our tree program, a special thank you to Pat Tobin for chairing the Tree Commission.

I am pleased to announce that we just approved the 2013-2014 Annual Village Budget with no tax increase. Over the past ten years I have tried to make sure that we spend only what we need to in order to keep our residents quality of life in tact while continuing the services provided to you. This year was the hardest year to balance the needs of the departments while trying to maintain a stable tax rate, but we were able to do so with the help of the Department Heads and Trustees. Not only will you see some familiar things happening, such as, the Symphony, Jazz concerts, Flower pots, and also the Fayetteville festival but you will also notice improvements to the Village this year.

Highlights from this year's budget include upgrades to the Accounting Software used by the Village Clerk, renovations to the DPW garage that will help with safety issues and reduce energy usage, our parks will be spruced up, and we will also be getting some new equipment to help us maintain the parks. Next year will be a challenge but please be assured we will do our best to manage this budget and continue to do our best to provide a stable tax rate.

In the past newsletters I've talked about the projects that we received grants for and are in the planning phases of. Well the planning and bidding part has been completed, and now I'm pleased to tell you that two projects are starting to mobilize as I write this article. Paving and sidewalk improvements in the lower Limestone Plaza area, funded, in part, through a grant we received from the County's "Save the Rain" Program, will begin in the next few weeks. This grant allowed the village to improve our storm water system in the area as well as update the parking lots, increase pedestrian walkways, and increase the safety of all who visit in the area. We are grateful to the county for allowing us to participate in this exciting program, and also provide the opportunity to improve the quality of life for our residents. The project is expected to start on May 13th and take about 8-10 weeks to complete. Please be patient during this construction project, as we will do everything in our power to complete this project as quickly as possible.

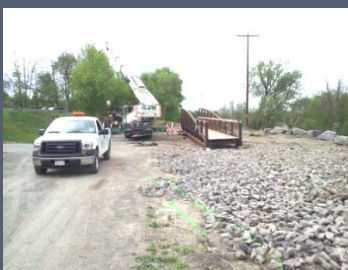
The bridge connecting Feeder Street and the Erie Canal has been delivered and now our DPW will be pouring concrete exit pads on each end of the bridge. In addition we will be building a fishing deck as well as pave the rest of the trails in Canal Landing Park for people to enjoy all that Limestone Creek has to offer. The DPW will continue to clean the Feeder Canal, work on drainage, install a parking lot, and clear open spaces to be able to stand relax or play Frisbee, this and more is expected to be completed in July. I'm amazed at the number of people that are walking, running and bicycling in the area, it's truly become more than I ever imagined. If you haven't already, come down and look at the improvements in this area.

The Route 5 culvert pipe replacement project near Brookside is on schedule for the first week in July. The state DOT officials say it should take 6-8 weeks. The detours and all the details will be handled by the State DOT; the village will be actively working on detour plans with our Fire & EMS as well as DPW. We will monitor the progress of the DOT, while working with state officials to make this as painless as possible. If something does come up please call the village office or send me an email. Please be assured we are ready at a moment's notice to react to any and all situations that could arise from a project of this size.

This is shaping up to be a very busy summer; I'm excited for all that is happening in our village, I'm also aware that all these projects will put stress on our local businesses and residents. In the end, these projects will enhance the lives of all Fayetteville Residents for years to come. I hope you have a great summer and please enjoy all the Fayetteville has to offer. Thank you, again, for the honor of serving as your mayor.

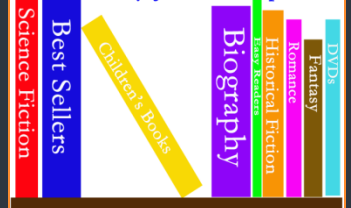

A little info and reminders,

Now that it is baseball season lets touch some bases:

- "are you ready?": Nice little card that can be obtained by going to the website ready.ongov.net. The card provides suggestions for being prepared in case of a disaster or other emergency.
- Remember to place brush and yard waste (but not grass clippings) next to the road, not in the road.
For sewer problems call the DPW before calling a private agency to unclog a sewer. Our DPW can determine where the back-up is. If it is between the clean out and the road we will fix it.
- We all enjoyed the flowers that lined our streets in the past years, but they come at a cost – so if inclined we accept donations toward this cost. If you feel that some flowers should be placed in an area that is not covered, call the village hall and your suggestion will be passed along
- The village hall is available for parties, meeting, or other events. In order to reserve the hall, you must be a village resident. Call the office for more information.
- Don't forget to sign your children up for the many programs provided by the Fayetteville Recreation Committee. If you have never taken part in these programs, explore all the possibilities that are available.
- We have a new law on fences and a law that governs sheds, out buildings, and garages. So if you are putting up a fence or adding a structure to your property check with the codes office before starting.
- There are many committees and boards looking for new members. Contact the mayor, one of the Trustees or the Village Office if you are interested in serving.
