drains with new oil and water separators, seam repairs for the roof, new slip-resistant floors, new office for the superintendent, and new training/conference room for the employees. These upgrades will allow us to keep the tradition of giving our employees the tools and resources to continue to provide the best service for the residents of Fayetteville.

The Signal Hill sewer project has been completed and is working as designed. This project was awarded a grant from EFC [Environmental Facilities Corp] for financing. The completed project was reviewed and signed off by EFC early this month. Thanks to our DPW crew, village clerk, Stearns & Wheeler and JJ Lane Co. for working very hard to complete this project on time and on budget. The biggest thank you goes to the residents of Signal Hill for putting up with a construction site for over eight weeks. I appreciated their patience and understanding during this time. This project will save taxpayers thousands of dollars once the project loan is paid off. Spending money today to save money ten years down the road for a long time is a good fiscal policy for all residents and in the end we accomplished the goal of the project.

The McIntyre Commons project is progressing through the planning board process. In the meantime you will see our DPW crews clearing debris from the Ledyard canal running through this property. Thanks to the developers, the village was able to receive this part of the Ledyard Canal. Many people may not know but our sewer system and storm sewer system run through this property. Which makes it a vital part of our village's infrastructure.

The crew at the DPW does an amazing job day in and day out, whether it's snowplowing, leaf pick-up, brush, garbage, taking care of our parks, street lights, storm sewers, paving, drainage work, and a whole lot more. This dedicated crew is one reason our village is the village that it is. With that being said, it is time for the DPW garage to get some needed repairs and a small addition. The work will include: new heating system in the garage, new floor

-structure as well as our history. This project is being funded through a grant from the Canal Corporation. The \$150,000 grant will be used for materials and engineering, and the work will be done by our DPW crew and specialty contractors when needed. This development will have twenty housing units on it and will help turn a once dilapidated factory into a very nice residential neighborhood. We are grateful to the developer and Canal Corporation for the help in making this project happen. If you would like more information on this project or any other commercial project in the village please stop into the village clerk's office and you can review the information with Deputy Clerk Shepardson.

The once bustling Syracuse Plastics factory will soon be bustling again. The planning board has approved a site plan for a new housing development to take place in this old factory, along with six detached units on the site. The developer and the planning board, as well as our codes enforcement officer, have been working hard to get all the details worked out so construction can begin on the units and return this factory to something all of us in this village can be proud of. There are plans at the village office that show you the layout as well as the materials and colors that are going to be used for this project. There is still a fair amount of work to be done but we are progressing together to make this happen because this development fits into what our comprehensive plan showed for this site.

The EFC Gateway project is moving along and should be ready to be unveiled later in the fall. The trustees, clerk, codes enforcement as well as our Parks Commission, Planning, Zoning, and HPC chairperson, have met to review concept ideas and to give our input to the designers. Following that meeting, the DPW superintendent and I discussed infrastructure needs, the needs of our business community and traffic concerns. This group will be meeting one more time to review and make changes. We will then be ready to meet with the businesses and residents in this area. After these meetings, we will be hosting a series of public hearings to bring all the residents up to

speed on this project. This project has an anticipated start date of April 2015 with an 8-12 week time frame. The grant for this project covers 90% of the costs with the other 10% coming from in-kind services and local taxpayer share. This project is vital to continuing to enhance the quality of life for not only our residents but all who come to shop, eat or just pass through our village. Recently, I had a chance to meet a couple who moved here from Maryland. When asked what drew them to our village, they said it was the charm, the history and the quality of life Fayetteville offers like no other community in our region. This project will enhance this and make Fayetteville even nicer than it is today.

As we look back at a beautiful summer, it's time to get ready for fall in Fayetteville, whether it's walking the tree lined streets as the leaves turn, or the kids going back to school, or maybe going to Fayetteville Fest in Beard Park to catch up with our neighbors and friends or just doing anything that makes you happy, please enjoy all that Fayetteville has to offer this time of year. This year my son Nathan, who was born the year I took office as a trustee, is headed off to college. I am excited and nervous all at once. Nathan has been at every event in the village over the past eighteen years. Every time he asked why I do what I do for the village I would always tell him that it's about making memories for the residents of Fayetteville to hold near and dear to themselves. I want my son to look back and say what a great place Fayetteville was to grow up in. Maybe one day he will want to come back and raise his family here in Fayetteville like I have, as well as so many others have. We are truly lucky to live in such a great area of the country. Everyone who works for the village along with myself will continue each and every day to work hard to make Fayetteville a place we all can be proud to call home. 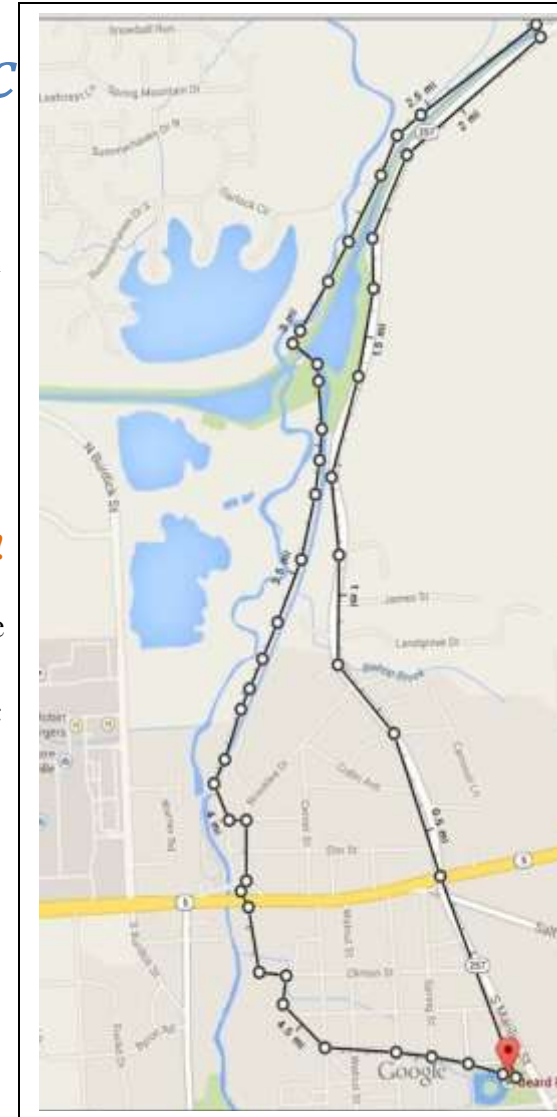

AUTUMN UPDATES FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS



- **Renovations at the DPW garage have begun** and we are all looking forward to the planned improvements. In the meantime, we hope that you will be patient if you cannot get a call through to us since the phones may occasionally be out of service.
- Maybe you have **noticed the purple boxes** in some of the ash trees around the village? In conjunction with the Tree Commission, the DPW is working to control the invasive spread of the Emerald Ash Borer.
- When closing swimming pools, please be aware that **discharging** chlorinated water, filter backwash, or water containing cleaning and disinfecting chemicals **into the street is not permitted**. The Village of Fayetteville is actively involved in the Storm Water Management Program.
- **Leaf pickup will begin soon.** Leaves can be placed along the curb, not in the road, and especially not on or near storm basins. The can also be put in the large brown bags sold by most hardware stores. Rocks and branches should not be mixed with the leaves because the village uses vacuum-operated leaf pickers. The leaf trucks will be around on a daily continuous rotating basis. Brush pickup will also continue, but we do not pick up grass clippings.
- If you need a **blue bin** for recycling, you can either call the DPW at 637-6065 for delivery or stop by the garage between 7:00 am and 3:30 pm. **The DPW no longer picks up electronics**; however OCRRA has excellent information regarding disposal at www.OCRRA.org
- Holidays falling on Monday, September 1 (Labor Day) and Monday, October 13 (Columbus Day) will not affect our regular collection schedule.

CODES ENFORCEMENT



SNOW. Whether you are ready or not to think about it...

You must be aware as you prepare for the upcoming winter season, **Snowplow Operators are required to obtain a license from the Village Office.**

Due to an increasing number of complaints the past few seasons, the village will be reinstating and enforcing this existing local law requiring snowplow operators to have a permit to operate within the village. As stated in Village Codes' Chapter 145

A. No person shall, within the Village of Fayetteville, engage in or carry on the business of snowplowing or snow removal for hire without first having obtained a license therefor as hereinafter provided.

B. No person shall hire, contract or otherwise employ an unlicensed snowplow operator to plow or remove snow from private property.

Licenses will be issued upon and subject to certain conditions, especially that "No one shall plow or remove snow in such a manner that it blocks sidewalks, leaves piles in the roadways, pushes or places snow or other material across any roadway or street onto property other than that being plowed."
