A Letter from the Mayor

I hope everyone is enjoying the changing leaves and the cold nip in the air. Around the corner is, with a bit of luck, a mild winter and a beautiful holiday season spent with family and friends. We are working very hard preparing, with our DPW, for leaf clean up as well as getting organized for the snow season. Our crews are ready for whatever Mother Nature throws our way. The Department of Public Works garage project is about halfway complete. This project includes a small addition for office space as well as upgrading the heating system, installing a new oil water separator and repair of the exterior doors and windows. This project was needed to keep our DPW crew and equipment in great shape for the future. I hope to be able to have an open house in the spring so all residents can see the improvements.

We will be hosting, at our first Trustees meeting in November, the final draft plan for the Gateway project in the lower village. This meeting will be to answer all questions and show the details of the project. We are hoping to put the project out to bid in December and have construction start in the April-May timeframe. We have hosted informational meetings with businesses and residents in the area and have incorporated the ideas put forward into the final plan. This project is made possible by a grant that covers 90 percent of the costs. We are looking forward to increasing pedestrian safety as well as interpretive signs and new benches to enhance this vital part of our village.

In September we treated some of the village roads with an oil and stone mixture. This process was used years ago but we stopped using it and switched to a cold mix application. In the beginning the cold mix application gave us good results but over time with less oils and less asphalt we started to see issues. Last year's long hard winter took a toll on a lot of these roads and the oil and stone treatment was applied to reinvigorate these roads. While I understand that this application wasn't ideal for all affected, it does have several benefits and I ask for your patience as we work to take care of as many paving issues as possible.

The Village is proactively taking measures to protect village trees.

The comprehensive plan was updated and approved at our last Board of Trustees' meeting. The original plan was created in 2008 and so much has changed since then. The new plan embraces all the changes that have happened in our village as well as planning out the next five-to-ten year future of the village. There is a copy on our web site as well as a hard copy for viewing at the Clerk's office in the Village hall. This important document is what we use in all our strategic planning as well as grant applications and show all perspective developers and commercial businesses. Thank you to everyone who made this update possible and a big thank you the firm EDR who helped the village form this great document.

Recently, Pascale's Bake House has chosen to relocate their operation to Drumlins. The village never wants to lose any vital business in our community and contrary to what has been written or reported the Village never asked the Bake House to leave the village. The Board of Trustees received a petition from a group of residents who live near the bake house, and we started to work with the Bake House to deal with this ongoing issue. While in this process, we were informed that the Bake House was going to relocate. I know many residents are upset but please be assured we did everything we could to work with the neighbors and the Bake House to resolve the complaint. In the end, Mr. Pascale chose to relocate. The balance of businesses' and residents' quality of life is something I take seriously. Misinformation does not help either party and I will continue to work on providing a quality of life that we can all be proud of.

The Planning Board recently approved two major housing projects in the village, the McIntyre Commons project on the site of the old paper mill and the Syracuse Plastics project. These designs will add new housing opportunities for all village residents. Recently, I attended a meeting on "Baby Boomers" and their needs and wants. The village is in a good position currently but these added options will not only enhance prospects for "Baby Boomers" but all residents looking for new alternatives. On the horizon is the development of the site previously known as O'Brien & Gere. We are currently working with several developers to come up with some exciting possibilities for our village.

As we come to the end of 2014, the village and our residents can be proud of the year that we've had. I look forward to next year and all the challenges ahead of us. With the help of our dedicated employees, great volunteer boards and first class services, I know our village will meet these challenges head on and prosper for years to come.

Historical Fayetteville News Notes: Just Yesterday – 1973

- ❖ After almost 100 years of operating its own water system, the Village of Fayetteville will lease its supply and pipes to the Onondaga County Water Authority and be entirely out of the water supply business. OCWA will make an immediate payment of \$200,000 and henceforth the 1,500 Fayetteville customers will buy Lake Ontario water at a cost estimated to be below what the village would have to charge to upgrade and maintain its own system. OCWA will also pay \$12,000 for Fayetteville's equipment and supplies.
- ❖ December 1 is the deadline for joining the village's sewer system that was completed in 1971.
- ❖ About 25 young people under the supervision of Diaspora Youth Center leaders, Jim and Carol Peck, walked the streets of Fayetteville and Manlius as well as the length of the FM Road collecting litter on September 8.
- ❖ The Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd was dedicated on October 7. The church campus has an entrance on Route 92 and another off Woodchuck Hill Road.
- ❖ Trees to help beautify Limestone Plaza were a joint project of the Fayetteville Lions Club and Boy Scout Troop 51. The Boy Scouts planted the trees in October.
- ❖ Despite the best efforts of local residents, the stately Elm trees along our streets are dying. The fatal fungus known as Dutch Elm disease is attacking and each tree is slowly dying as the fungus clogs the tree's circulation system.
- ❖ Local residents are urging the development of a bicycle trail between Fayetteville and Manlius along the former Chenango railroad bed. Ideas and plans have been presented to the Manlius Village Recreation Commission and the Town is asking its Parks and Recreation Commission to study the trail plan.

REMIND YOUR SNOW PLOWER:

Snowplow Operators are required to obtain a license from the Village Office.

As stated in Village Codes' Chapter 145:

A. No person shall, within the Village of Fayetteville, engage in or carry on the business of snowplowing or snow removal for hire without first having obtained a license therefor as hereinafter provided.

B. No person shall hire, contract or otherwise employ an unlicensed snowplow operator to plow or remove snow from private property.

Licenses will be issued upon and subject to certain conditions, especially that "No one shall plow or remove snow in such a manner that it blocks sidewalks, leaves piles in the roadways, pushes or places snow or other material across any roadway or street onto property other than that being plowed."

Permit applications are available through the Village Website, www.fayettevilleny.gov or by visiting the Village Clerk's Office.

Any time you are planning structural or other changes to your property, please check with the Village Codes Officer. It is best to check before, rather than having a problem after starting your project.

If a street light is out or blinking in your neighborhood, please contact the Village Office. We will notify the appropriate department.

Many times we have issues that apply to a certain zone or area within the Village. While the issue may not directly affect your neighborhood, it is wise to be aware of changes or laws that are established.

Good Tidings to You!

Village of Fayetteville DEPT. OF PUBLIC WORKS

The Department of Public Works trucks will be around on a continuous rotating basis for leaf pickup. Place leaves along the curb, not in the road or near storm drains. Leaves should not be placed in bags or other containers because the village uses vacuum-operated leaf pickers. *It is especially important that no rocks or branches are mixed in with the leaves.* Brush pickup will continue as weather permits.

PLEASE USE ONLY 35 GALLON OR SMALLER TRASH CONTAINERS. FOR SAFETY REASONS, THE CONTAINER AND ITS CONTENTS SHOULD NOT WEIGHT MORE THAN 55 POUNDS.

- Any pumpkins for disposal? just place them beside your trash, not in the container, and they will be picked up.

Snow Season Reminders:

- Sewer concerns? Call the DPW first at 637-6065 to help determine which side of the line the problem exists.
- The restrooms at Canal Landing Park will be closed for the winter season, but the park is still open to the public.
- Please avoid parking across public sidewalks so the sidewalk plow operator can get through.
- It is a violation of New York State Vehicle and Traffic law for anyone to place snow in the street.
