RE: Electronics (E-Waste) Disposal



Hauler Requirements under NYS Electronic Equipment Recycling and Reuse Act of 2010

<u>January 1, 2015</u> - Individual and household disposal ban becomes effective. *No entity may dispose of e-waste* as trash in New York State.

Persons engaged in the collection of solid waste for delivery to a NYS solid waste management facility (i.e. private or municipal solid waste haulers/transporters) must provide written information to users (i.e. residents, businesses, government entities, etc.) of such facility regarding the proper methods for the recycling of electronic waste. (Environmental Conservation Law Article 27 Title 26 Section 27-2611)

In short:

- You must inform your customers that electronics are banned from the trash
- You must inform your customers how to properly recycle their electronic waste.

Under the State Law, electronics include:

- Televisions (as well as cathode ray tubes)
- Computers
- Computer Peripherals* (Monitors, Keyboards, Mice or Similar Pointing Devices, Facsimile Machines, Document Scanners, Printers)
- Small Electronic Equipment* (VCRs, Digital Video Recorders, Portable Digital Music Players, DVD Players, Digital Converter Boxes, Cable or Satellite Receivers, Electronic or Video Game Consoles, etc.)
- Small Scale Servers
- * Computer peripherals and small electronic equipment also include any cable, cord or wiring permanently affixed to or incorporated into such product.
