A Letter from the Mayor

I hope 2016 brings you and your family happiness and health. For the village, 2016 has several important things happening. The village is in the planning phases of projects of its own, such as: the Western Gateway project (near Starbucks), the Canal Landing Phase 4 project, and the continuation of the sanitary sewer slip-lining project in Brookside. Additional activities at this time include village budget review, commercial projects in the works, and the recent release of both the Consensus report and the State annual budget. There are also several great events coming up. On March 6th, the 18th Annual Mayor's Turkey Dinner (with all the trimmings, benefitting the Senior Center) and the Village Easter Egg Hunt (3/26), to name just two. All this makes our village a vibrant and exciting place to live, and for that I am grateful to all our dedicated employees, volunteers and elected officials who have helped us make these projects a reality.

Another item that is still a work in progress is the village deer management plan. The plan itself was approved at our November 9th Board of Trustees Meeting. The approved plan can be viewed on the village website. It may take longer to initiate this

plan than first thought, but we have been carefully reviewing the many details involved with it. We continue to work with the NYS DEC and USDA to implement this plan in the right way at the right time.

I want you to know that the OBG project has been withdrawn. We had an opportunity to sit down with the developer to show them the road that they would have to face to make this project a reality. I commend OBG for listening to the concerns of the residents', the FM school district as well as the village. In the end, the process worked. I think we all agree something should be done on that site, but it just needs to be the right fit. We will continue to do our best to maintain a balance that meets the residents' quality-of-life needs as well as business' needs.

We have been very fortunate to get several grants, our employees have been instrumental in getting several projects done in-house versus hiring outside services which has saved thousands of dollars. We will continue to do our best in providing services you have come to expect from our village, but the State will need to step up and do their part. The state budget, released last month by the governor, offered no relief from the burden that state government puts on all villages in New York. Please reach out to our state leaders and let them know how you feel.



The consensus report was released last week. I had the privilege to serve on the commission and I ask that everyone take time to read through the report. A POINT of INTEREST:

It may surprise you to know that Village of Fayetteville Department of Public Works , when time and work force permits, clears village sidewalks using a sidewalk plow. This equipment is not always appropriate to all sidewalks. As stated in Chapter 147-8, of the Codes of the Village of Fayetteville:

"The occupant of each and every house or building fronting upon any street or alley, or the owner or the agent of the owner of any vacant lot fronting as aforesaid, shall at all times keep the sidewalk and gutter along the premises clear and free of all rubbish and obstructions of all kinds and shall also keep closely cut all grass and weeds along the sidewalk, and shall clear such sidewalk of all snow or ice that shall accumulate every day by 9:30 a.m. of each day and cause the same to be kept clean from all snow and ice. "



Happy New Year! Can you name the most common topic of discussion in the Village?? I'd bet you a cup of coffee at the new Dunkin Donuts the answer is TRAFFIC! Traffic, including speeding in the village, has always been a hot topic with me. Now, as the village's liaison with the Town of Manlius Police Department, I am helping to lead the village towards improving traffic flow throughout our village. A daunting task for sure, but we are committed to doing our best to improve and/or maintain the quality of life in the Village. And we are taking some positive steps.

- 1.) The village has created a Traffic Committee that I chair. This committee of 7 residents began meeting last August. Our goal is to provide guidance to the village board on how to improve traffic. This includes specific issues (like should there be a stop sign placed on a street) and broad issues, like traffic routing and interfacing with the NYS DOT.
- 2.) The village (with the traffic committee guidance) applied for a comprehensive traffic study to be completed by the Syracuse Metropolitan Traffic Council. By the time you read this, we should know if our proposal has been approved. We are optimistic that it will be. The study will provide the village, county and NYS DOT with hard data on our traffic situation and it is hoped that we can use this information to make the informed decisions about how we deal with the issues.
- 3.) We have purchased a new traffic/speed counter (the original one was stolen a few months ago!). This allows us to continue to record our own traffic data. We have taken many readings of both volume and speeds all over the village. We will continue to use this technology so we have real data to address local traffic questions or concerns.
- 4.) We actively engage with the Town of Manlius Police Department to identify areas that need extra enforcement. For example, a resident near Brookside noted the speed of cars on Route 5 was increasing. Within a day, TMPD deployed their speed warning signs and increased patrols in that area. TMPD is also patrolling the side roads of the village and I hope their presence will cut down on the speed some folks drive on our small roads.

We have a lot of work to do. It is in all our interests that we work together, with the county, and the NYS DOT to find meaningful solutions to traffic problems. The committee is open to all ideas so feel free to contact me at my village email address.

Now that snow season has officially arrived, it is important to remember that no parking is allowed on village streets from November 1 to April 15. Snow plowed by a private contractor or resident should not be moved into the street. Use caution when approaching or following a village plow.

Please call the DPW at 637-6065 to report potholes along with lawn and/or mailbox damage caused by Village of Fayetteville plows. The village is not responsible for damage resulting from private contractors. We will be around as soon as the weather permits for repairs.

It is worth repeating that New York State no longer allows anyone to dispose of e-waste as trash. Please check the village website for more information or contact NYS DEC at 518-402-8788 or ewaste@dec.ny.gov.

Brush and yard waste pickup will continue, depending on the weather. The village does not pick up grass clippings.

Since Good Friday falls on the day C&D is collected, it will be picked up on Monday, March 28. The Memorial Day holiday, Monday, May 30, will not affect our regular trash and recycling schedule.

If you need a blue bin for recycling, you can either call us to request one or stop by the garage, 5572 North Manlius Street, between 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.
