**A Letter****from the Mayor**

Dear Residents,

As I start my fourth term in office, I am as excited as I was the very first day I became mayor. We are truly blessed to have a community that has such a rich history of culture, character and community. Much of the vibrancy of our village is due to our dedicated employees and volunteers who give countless hours for the betterment of our village, also our elected officials who help each and every day to improve our village. The most important resource this village has however, is our residents who choose to live in Fayetteville. It has been an honor and pleasure to serve the residents of Fayetteville for the last twelve years as mayor.

The USDA has issued its final report for the deer culling operations. We were able to donate 2,632 lbs. of venison to the Food Bank of CNY and they will be able to serve over 7,800 meals. We have been contacted by the City of Syracuse & Town of Camillus to review our plan and program. The deer committee is working on several projects that were approved in the management plan such as public outreach, public education, Tick drags, coordinating efforts with state parks, and reviewing USDA recommendations.

Please keep an eye on the website for new information. Another big thank you to our deer committee for all their hard work and to

Vanessa Hulchanski from the village office for coordinating the program.

There have been several commercial development proposals in recent weeks in the village. While most of these projects are still in the planning phases, if completed, they will transform several areas of our village. A variety of proposals are under review, ranging from new shops and apartments, to a new restaurant, to a hair salon, to townhouses with mixed professional offices. These projects need final approvals from our planning and zoning boards but they are good signs that the village is heading in the right direction.

Keeping a balance of commercial development with residents' quality of life is something that we work very hard to do. We strive to strike a balance that meets the needs of all involved. We are working with each of the boards to make sure they continue to keep these goals in mind. This process is not always easy and sometimes everyone doesn't get what they want, but in the end, if we all work together, listen and learn from each other, good things will happen. The village is continuing to invest in our infrastructure, working with our comprehensive plan and most importantly looking for the right fit for our future.

Our 2016 budget begins June 1st. This is our thirteenth year with no tax increase. We have been able to do this with planning, budgeting and spending every tax dollar as if it were our own. This year we were able to do this due to our department heads holding the line on spending and by using our reserves that we have set up over the years to pay for capital expenses. We budget for years ahead to pay for big ticket items rather than borrowing.

Meetings:

The Board of Trustees meet every 2nd and 4th Monday of each month.

The Planning Board meets the 1st Monday of each month.

The Zoning Board meets every 3rd Monday of each month.

Village meetings are open to the public. Come see your community in action.

This practice was started before me and has served our village well. We will continue do our best to provide the best possible services to our residents while maintaining a stable tax rate. Even though the budget starts June 1st, it is something we continue to monitor and work on throughout the year. *A copy of the budget will be posted on our website.*

Our paving schedule will be coming out soon, as we are planning on paving several streets in the village this year. In addition to the list, when approved, being posted on the village website, the DPW and the paving company will notify any involved residents ahead of the planned paving times. NY State budget allots CHIPS funding for local municipal roadway improvement projects. Like last year, we will spend 100% of the CHIPS funds on paving projects. The Cape Seal process worked well last year and we will be continuing this process. We also will be working with the FM School District to pave East Franklin Street between Route 257 and the bridge near the bus garage. This project will take place before school begins with help from both the Town and the School District. This is a great example of three different municipalities working together on a common goal, to help each other while saving taxpayers' money. We have done this for years and will continue to collaborate with all of our surrounding municipal partners.

The Western Gateway project will begin construction in the next few weeks. We have secured a contractor, and are working on getting everyone mobilized and ready for this exciting project. This development in the lower village will improve pedestrian safety as well as give this area a well-needed makeover with new trees, landscaping, retention basins, signage, benches and welcome signs as people enter our village. This project was funded by an EFC grant that covers 90% of the cost of the project. The project will divert several thousands of gallons of water from Limestone Creek into the ground where it belongs.


We have begun planning for two other major projects in the spring of 2017. The first

project is Canal Landing Phase 4. This phase includes replacing the bridge over the feeder canal, as well as paving Feeder Street to the Erie Canal and adding new interruptive signage, street lights and a pedestrian bridge to the nearby ball fields. This project is being funded by a grant from the NYS DOT and Canal Corporation. The second project is a culvert pipe repair in the Carriage Hill development. Bishops Brook waterway has two deteriorated bridge structures that need to be repaired and shored up. We hope that we can work with our state and federal partners to find a grant solution to assist with the cost of this project.

There is so much more happening every day in the village. This is why I'm so excited about the next few weeks, months, and years in our village. Everyone who works and volunteers for our village gives it their all, each and every day, for the betterment of all the residents. We currently have openings on several boards and would love to have more residents become involved in the shaping of future Fayetteville.

Department of Public Works

Now that spring is here it is a good time for reminders:

Winter sidewalk and plow damage is being repaired as the weather permits.

Parks are being prepared for summer and are maintained daily.

Brush and yard waste should be out for pickup each Monday. If we cannot get around the entire village on Monday, we will continue until it is complete. Please refrain from putting brush out after it has been collected in your neighborhood. Yard waste may be placed in cans or bags made for that purpose but not in plastic bags. The DPW does not pick up grass clippings. If you have a contractor doing your lawn care, the contractor is responsible for removing any debris. Free mulch is available for pick up at the DPW garage, 5572 North Manlius Street.

Hard fill (sod, dirt, rocks, concrete, masonry and bricks) is collected the third Friday of each month. Construction debris (wood, plaster, drywall, plumbing fixtures etc) is picked up the last Friday of each month. Hard fill and construction debris can be put out on Thursday or early Friday morning for Friday pickup. Discarded materials from work requiring a Village of Fayetteville permit require removal by the contractor.

The village will be celebrating Independence Day, July 4th and Labor Day, September 5th both of which fall on a Monday. Trash and recycling will not be affected by these holidays and yard waste collection will begin on Tuesday.

Both the village and OCRRA have excellent websites and we encourage you to use them for additional information.

There are several special village projects scheduled for the remainder of the season along with our regular schedules so we are anticipating a very busy summer.
