

"Will the snow ever end?" I know many are asking that exact question as you're reading our spring 2022 newsletter!! Hopefully we are at the end of the winter, and flowers and spring cleaning are in our futures.

Thank you to all the residents who came out for our Comprehensive Plan Open House at the senior center. I appreciate not only those who showed up in person but also everyone who has taken time to fill out the survey questionnaire online as well. The updated plan will set our course for years to come. Your help & input is crucial in making good sound decisions as we move the village forward.

I'm grateful to all the residents who came and supported the annual Mayor's Turkey Dinner 3/6 at the Senior Center. This event was started by the late Mayor Henry McIntosh and this was the first year of its 24 years that Henry hasn't been at this great event. I'm pleased that this year's event raised over \$6500 for the center. Thank you for coming out to support our seniors.

I'd also like to thank all who came out for our recent village election. Welcome aboard, newly elected Trustee Mark Matt. As we move forward with retail cannabis operations in the village, we will do everything we can to listen to the concerns and opinions as we craft new legislation for these new business opportunities in the village.

Currently we are doing budget workshops to craft the 2022/2023 fiscal budget for the village. **This year's budget does not change the village tax rate of \$7.20 per thousand.** It also continues to fully fund the programs that make our village one of the most vibrant villages in all of upstate NY. There is a video on our website that explains the budget; it contains all the workings of our budget. The proposed budget is linked online too. These workshops and public engagement continue to the end of April when we are required by law to have the budget passed.

We are in the planning stages for the summer concert series in Beard Park, Parties in the Plaza, and our annual Memorial Day Parade. Our DPW is busy with spring cleaning and summer project planning throughout the village. Our busy fire department has hired EMS-only employees. This program was created to provide a better staffed service while enhancing our partnerships with the villages of Minoa & Manlius. We are in the infant stages of this new program; I will keep you updated in future newsletters as we get farther into this program. Our Senior Center, Recreation & other nonprofit groups in the village are just as active. We are coordinating weekly with all of these very important aspects of our village life.

We are **looking for volunteers for both our Parks & Tree Commissions** as well as future alternate members for our various boards. If interested, please contact the village office. As always I want to thank our many dedicated employees & volunteers who make the Village of Fayetteville what it is. We are truly lucky to have such dedicated, passionate, professional people serving our residents. Thank you for reading this article and please, as always, call or email me with your questions.
