Garbage/Recycling Cart Options

Eligibility

Most residences and businesses are eligible for regularly scheduled waste collection by the Village Department of Public Works (DPW). This is considered a standard Village service which is subject to specific procedures explained throughout this booklet.

Residents and Businesses that currently have their trash/recyclables picked up by the village will be issued one trash and one recycling cart, both the same size carts. An additional trash and/or recycling cart option is only allowed with the 96 gallon carts. There is a limit of two trash and/or recycling carts per property.

****The carts are property of the Village of Fayetteville and must remain where they are disbursed. The carts are not to be modified or defaced in any way.. ****

Preparation of Carts for Garbage Collection

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Garbage/recycling in cart does not exceed 150 lbs 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The lid(s) of the garbage/recycling carts are completely shut
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Placed on level ground 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carts are at least three feet or an arm’s length away from each other and any other objects such as a mailbox, telephone poles, parked cars, etc.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carts are placed by the curb the night before your service or by 6:00 am on your collection day 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carts are placed at the curb no earlier than 12 hours prior to pick up and is returned to the structure/dwelling no later than 12 hours after pick up
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carts are not placed near low hanging wires and tree branches 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carts are placed as close to the road as possible
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only acceptable items in the carts 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cart wheels and handles are placed facing the house
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All trash must be bagged. No loose trash in carts 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trash bags must be clear or white

Pick up Refusal

The DPW may refuse pick up if any of the above conditions are not met. See “Violations/Issues” information on page 14.



Rubbish and Garbage Examples

Acceptable garbage:

Recycling

Preparation

Recycling cart shall be placed at the curb by 6:00 am on the designated recycling route day. The recycling carts should be removed within 12 hours of collection. Refrain from placing recycling in plastic bags for collection. If you have a question as to whether a product is recyclable or garbage, please visit the OCRRA website: www.ocrra.org

Food Scrap Pick Up



- The Village offers a **vegan** food scrap pick up twice a month
 - Vegetable, fruit scraps, coffee grounds, tea ONLY
 - NOT ACCEPTING meat, fish, bones dairy, eggs, animal waste, grass clippings
- **To join this pilot program please reach out to the Village Office**
- Pick ups are the 1st and 3rd Friday each month
- Scrap bin should be placed where you would place trash cart
- Start date is March 1st 2024

Yard Waste

pick up starts on Monday and continues until the Village streets have been picked up. Brush must be out by 6:00 am Monday morning.

November is the only month the DPW does not pick up yard waste. Brush pick up in October ends the last full week of the month.



Yard Waste Examples

Preparation

- Yard waste must be placed at the curb.
- Brush, shrubs, and tree branches must be in a container or piled as neatly as possible. They cannot exceed 48” in length and/or 12” in diameter. They must weigh less than 40 lbs.

Yard Waste DOES NOT Include:

- Work done by a contractor.
- Grass clippings.
- Lumber or large trees.
- Lawn edging - see hardfill.

Leaf Season Information

- November: The DPW focuses solely on leaf pick up during the month of November. There is no brush, hardfill, or construction debris pick up.
- The DPW picks up leaves daily and follows routes to get through the entire village.
- Please rake leaves to the curb but not in the street.
- Do not put leaves near storm basins.
- Do NOT put leaves in plastic bags.
- Leaves mixed with brush will NOT be picked up during leaf season.



Hardfill Pick Up

- **Hardfill debris pick must be scheduled with the village no later than the Friday prior to pick up.**
- **If debris is not scheduled it will not be picked up.**
- pick up is on the THIRD Friday of every month (except November)
- Items for pick up must be at the curb by 6:00 am the day of pick up.
- If a holiday falls on the third Friday of the month, pick up will be moved to the following Monday.
- Acceptable hardfill items:
 - Dirt
 - Lawn edging
 - Stones
 - Bricks
 - Concrete
 - Broken up slabs, blocks, deck footers/fence posts (all wood must be removed)
- Please see the Village of Fayetteville's website for specific dates



Construction Debris

- **Construction debris pick must be scheduled with the village no later than the Friday prior to pick up.**
- **If debris is not scheduled it will not be picked up.**
- pick up is the LAST Friday of the month.
- Items must be out by 6:00 AM the day of pick up.
- If a holiday falls on the last Friday of the month, pick up will be the following Monday.
- Must consist of NON-HAZARDOUS material. Prohibited materials include but are not limited to asbestos.
- Shall not contain loose nails. Lumber shall be nail free or bent over to protect employees.
- All loose debris must be placed within a container that meets the Village's criteria for garbage containers.
- Shall be secured so that it will not be spread by wind or animals.
- Any debris that will deteriorate, break down, or become heavy with absorbed moisture must be placed in a water-resistant container or wrapped in a water-resistant covering to keep the material dry.
 - This includes, but is not limited to:
 - Plaster lath
 - Sheetrock
 - Insulation
 - Paper fabrics
- Debris **MUST** be generated at and removed from the property where the debris is placed for curbside pick up and where there was no permit required.



No debris shall be placed outside for pick up more than 24 hours before the scheduled day of pick up.

Any remaining containers or debris that were not picked up must be removed from the curbside within 24 hours after the scheduled day of pick up.

The Village of Fayetteville DPW will NOT pick up ANY debris, hardfill, or yard waste that is generated when a Building Permit has been issued or when the debris, hardfill or yard waste (including leaves) is produced by a paid person/businesses.

- **This includes but is not limited to - contractors, landscapers, tree removal companies.**

Bulky Item Pick Up

This pick up is designed for trash items that are too big to fit in your cart.

THIS IS NOT for Construction and Demolition (C&D) materials. No construction debris will be taken on bulky item pick up.

Items scheduled for pick up must be at the curb by 6:00am on the day of pick up.

Items put out for pick up that are NOT scheduled will not be picked up.

You must schedule your bulky items for pick up the Friday prior to the scheduled pick up date.

Scheduled pick up dates for bulky items will be the second Wednesday of every month. If a holiday conflicts with the scheduled date, pick up will be the following day.

See the Village of Fayetteville's website for specific dates for pick up.

Loose trash will not be picked up. Items out that have not been scheduled to be picked up will not be picked up.

Examples of bulky items eligible for pick up include, but are not limited to:

- Carpet
- Mattresses
- Couches/Sofas
- Chairs/Recliners
- Desks
- Dressers
- Tires (no rims)
- Metal

The following items will be picked up at cost:

- Mattresses (\$15 per mattress)
- Tires with no rims (\$5 per tire)
- 10 or more items in one month (\$100)

Items that require payment will not be picked up until payment is received by the Village. (Payments can be made online, by mail or at the village clerk office.)

Unacceptable Items/No Curbside Pick up

- **Fluorescent Lamp Bulbs**
- **Propane tanks**
- **Batteries**
- **Medical waste**
- **Oil** (Per NYS law, most vehicle service and vehicle retail businesses must accept used motor oil for recycling at no charge to the public. Call your local retailers or service centers for take-back programs and restrictions.)
- **Paint or paint-like products** (There is a takeback program for most household paint products. Learn more at paintcare.org - find out what is acceptable and the closest drop off location to you.) Latex paints can be dried out with kitty litter or sawdust and once completely dry/hardened, can go in the garbage, if dropping it off to a PaintCare location is not desired. Lids must be removed from paint cans and placed in the garbage.
- **Household toxins (beyond paint products)** (visit www.OCCRA.org for details on how to manage toxics through OCCRA's free drop off program. Appointment required.)

Violations/Issues:

We will have a tagging system in place for improperly put out items. Each household/dwelling will be allotted two warnings prior to a final warning with a fine set by the Village Board of Trustees and refusal of pick ups.

1. First Offense
 - a. If any item set out for pick up is put out improperly we will issue a warning.
 - b. This warning is intended to inform the resident of any mistake made.
 - c. Items that are improperly put out will not be picked up until they are put out properly.
2. Second Offense:
 - a. If any item set out for pick up is put out improperly we will issue a warning.
 - b. This warning is intended to inform the resident of any mistake made.
 - c. Items that are improperly put out will not be picked up until they are put out properly.
 - d. Final warning prior to fine being assessed and refusal of pick up.
3. 3rd/Final Offense:
 - a. Denial of any pick ups until fine is paid.
 - b. For every offense after the third offense an additional fine will be assessed.
