A Letter from the Mayor

Wow this summer seemed to fly by, so much happened in the village this summer...the concerts in the park, the Party in the Plazas, the neighborhood block parties, and time spent with family and friends. I hope everyone had a great summer. Fall is another exciting season filled with many activities and events. Please review all the exciting happenings in the village over the next few months. The village board has been very busy this summer working on several projects that will have longlasting impacts on our village. One of these great projects is our new entrance signs that where constructed by our DPW crew. Special thank you goes to Gary Way, a retired DPW employee who came back to help us with these incredible signs.

The first project is our Safe-Routes-to-School project. This project funded by a grant from the Federal and state governments will provide new sidewalks from Redfield to Pine Ridge with a pedestrian bridge going over Bishops Brook, as well as new ADA sidewalks and ramps installed in the center of the village. Initially the project went out to bid later than planned and then we did not receive any bids. Fortunately working with NYS DOT we were able to quickly go out to bid again with some changes and have now awarded the sidewalk portion of the project. We anticipate work starting in September. The pedestrian bridge portion of the project will have to wait until the spring. When this project is complete, every village resident will have safe access to a sidewalk in our village, truly



making our sidewalk system connected throughout the village.

In addition to the SRTS project we were also fortunate to receive a grant through the CFA grant process to repair Bishops Brook and for Limestone Creek bank stabilization. This project will fix where the brook in these two areas has washed away the banks and has compromised walkways and bridge structures. The Board of Trustees has completed the SEQR process and we have started to put the plans together to get the necessary approvals. Our hope is to have this project out to bid by this winter in order to begin this very important village infrastructure project in spring 2020.

We are still working with Onondaga County WEP(Waste Environmental Protection) on the village sewer system. We have fortunately been proactive with projects in the village in maintaining our system. We have entered into several MOU (Memo of Understanding) to study the costs of repairing the whole village sewer system, and to camera the

whole village to see the condition of the system. After these reports are put together we will be working with the County to find the best solution for the Meadowbrook issue. Both the villages of Fayetteville and Manlius have been chosen to be the first municipalities to enter into the county program. This project will help all residents for years to come. All village sewer pipelines will be slip-lined to ensure they will not leak for the next 50 years. Slip-lining will also decrease I&I from entering the plant at Meadowbrook which is causing these issues. I want to thank County Executive Ryan McMahon for helping our village with this important project.

We are also excited to announce that we have applied for a grant to finish Canal Landing Park. This grant should be the final part of this 15-year process. We are looking to add pavilions, kayak launches, new trails, multipurpose fields, bathrooms, and scenic views of Limestone Creek and the Erie Canal. The grant looks to complete the connections with all the incredible assets the village has in this area. We want to thank our many partners- NYS Parks, Town of Manlius, Fayetteville Parks Commission, FM Pop Warner, FM Little League, Fayetteville Fireman's Association, Lions Club and many more. This will truly be a park that works with all community groups to make this possible. We should hear by early next year if we are successful.

At our August Village Board meeting we worked on two important projects. We denied the 547 East Genesee Street/OBG property zone change application, as the project did not address our concerns from many areas. We also started the process of reviewing

the newly proposed project at the corner of Highbridge Street in the lower village. This project will need to go through the SEQR review process as well as public hearings and village board review. I ask all residents to learn more about the project by coming to the village office or going on our website (which is in the process of being updated!) We will be asking the developer for 3D views and/or videos to help us understand how it will look and what the impact will be for our village. We will always continue to work on what is best for the whole village and I truly believe the village board has done a great job keeping this balance of character, quality of life and moving our village forward. We have also updated our MS4 and Hazard Mitigation reports with the state and Federal governments. These two reports are critical in our village safety and security for all our residents, so we will continue to work with all partners from the state, county and federal governments to make this a priority.

I am grateful to our village departments for all their hard work and dedication. We have a very vibrant village, new commercial development, with new restaurants and shops to see. It truly takes a village to make all this happen. The Fire Department and DPW continue to provide incredible services, our Codes and Clerk's office are always continuing to keep our village running and moving forward. Thank you to our dedicated employees, village board and volunteers whose services make our village incredible.
