First, we have our updated [comprehensive plan](#) coming out soon. Please take the time to read it on our village website. This updated plan is our road map for our village. I'd like to thank our comprehensive plan steering committee for their time and effort in putting this plan together. We also have begun our 2023-2024 budget process, with two new trustees (Trustee Matt & Trustee Rice). The process will be the same as in years past, making sure we keep our village moving forward while investing in quality of life projects that enhance our village and maintain its historic and special feel. We will continue to look at each tax dollar and do our best to make this a budget that all village taxpayers can be happy with.

We also are in the middle of our County Main Street grant program. We were successful in 2021 receiving close to \$300,000 for our village Main Street. This program helps the Village invest in projects that support our business owners in a shared investment program. This year's grant application has eight projects that would help transform our main street for years to come while maintaining our village charm. More information will be available on our website.

We are in the interviewing process for a new DPW superintendent. Pat Masset has been with our village of over 40 years, and he has decided it's time to retire. I want to thank Pat & the DPW crew for all they do for our village.

Our DPW is currently working on a Phase 6 project for Canal Landing Park that will be adding a pedestrian bridge and parking area behind our little league field #2. This will help with the many people using this area including those who use the Erie Canal. This project will be starting soon. We also are working with OCCRA on our new garbage & recycling program. New pick-up programs coming soon. We would like to get ahead of the requirements from OCCRA and we will look at all options in front of us. We plan to have public forums and workshops to look at the best plan to implement these changes.

This newsletter is about the departments in our village and what's happening in each area. Our village is truly lucky to have these vital departments making our life better each and every day. Thank you to all these departments for what you do to make our village what it is. I'm excited for what is ahead of us. Our village is moving forward on so many fronts. - Please know that in the spring and when the snow has cleared, the village DPW will go around to do a spring "cleanup" where needed to patch areas that may have been grazed by the snowplow.
- OCCRA.ORG is a great resource for information on what and how to recycle various items, or if it should go in trash.
- The trash pickup schedule is rarely affected by a holiday. (Trash pickup days occur Tuesday thru Thursday.) You can always check online; any changes would be posted on the website calendar.
- **SUMMER HOURS:** June thru Labor Day the DPW crew work four 10-hour days Tuesday thru Friday 6:00am to 4:30pm.
- **Park Reminders:** parks are closed dusk to dawn; Canal Park bathrooms closed until spring; Duguid Dog Park will be locked when more than 6-inches of snow.

Common Code violations to avoid in the Village:

- Not cleaning up after your dog;
- Placing a sign on village property between the sidewalk and the street;
- Attaching signs or posters to telephone poles or other public property;
- Installing a swimming pool over 24" deep without a building permit;
- Building a deck or other structure or remodeling without a building permit;
- Parking a vehicle, licensed or not, in the front yard;
- Parking an unlicensed vehicle outdoors.

If you wish to file a complaint about a code violation, please fill out a Complaint Form and submit it to the Village Clerk's office.

Please screen your building contractors- get referrals, check references and with the BBB before hiring.

Remember: Contractors are responsible for building debris created during any contracted work. Contact the DPW if you have questions regarding construction debris.

Remind your snow plow contractor that a permit is required to plow snow in the Village of Fayetteville.

Be mindful about what goes into the storm sewers! Storm water management guidelines can be found on the Village's website.
